The committee invites your nominations for the Mary Ann and John D. Mangels Lecture Series for the next two academic years. Endowed in 1990, the Mary Ann and John D. Mangels Lecture Series, in cooperation with GO-MAP, academic departments and programs, invites minority scholars or individuals whose work focuses on issues of diversity for the benefit of minority students, the campus community, and the general public.

By bringing top minds from around the world to the University to teach and speak to the public, the Mangels Endowment and the Graduate School help the University pursue its vital goal of disseminating knowledge. To further this goal, we're seeking nominees who can address the most important issues facing society. From the environment to mental health to social justice, we want to talk about it all. We're relying on your nominations to help foster this dialogue.

We are seeking nominees who can inspire collaboration or co-sponsorship among several UW departments or organizations.

Selected nominees will be asked to spend a minimum of 2 days on campus. In addition to a public lecture they will be asked to attend a private dinner and reception. Time permitting, they also will be asked to spend some time with students in a classroom/seminar setting.

The lecture series offers an honorarium starting at \$3,500 plus hotel and travel.

To make a nomination to the Mangels Series you must be either a current or emeritus member of the UW faculty. No self nominations or <u>past Mangels lecturers</u>, please. Please submit a one- to two-page document that:

- Addresses the nominee's speaking ability and skill at engaging a generally informed and diverse public audience
- · Provides an explanation of how their visit will enhance the University community and GO-MAP's mission
- Include all co-sponsorship letters of support when you make your submission

The deadline for all nominations is Thursday, January 24, 2019 at 5:00 p.m.
