RECRUITMENT & OUTREACH

(GSEE) provides approximately \$2 million in annual fellowships and awards to support the recruitment and success of graduate students with diverse perspectives and experiences.

GSEE supports departmental efforts to identify and encourage prospective students to consider the UW for graduate study.

OUR OUTREACH INCLUDES:

- **Connecting** prospective students from various communities with current graduate students through our Outreaching Grads (OGs) Program.
- Building community with prospective and current UW graduate students to increase peer experiences and graduate student success through GSEE events and programming.
- Utilizing the National Name Exchange (NNE), a consortium of more than 100 major U.S. institutions that inform undergraduates about graduate opportunities.
- Highlighting virtual and in-person forums, conferences, and seminars to recruit prospective students.

- Participate in professional development opportunities, when possible.
- Share graduate opportunities with UW registered student organizations to promote graduate education.
